In your abstract, please specify if your presentation will be an academic paper or a creative writing piece. We welcome both individual presentations or panel proposals of 3-4 presenters (please note: we may also consider individual presentations for inclusion on a panel). Presentations will be 15 minutes long followed by 5 minutes for questions.

**Along with your abstract be sure to include:** your name, your university affiliation, the title of your presentation, whether you are proposing an individual or panel presentation, and a short academic biography. Please indicate if you will need audiovisual equipment for your presentation.
